If you are late to sign up, you are responsible to complete all the deadlines that passed before your acceptance within 3 DAYS of your acceptance (this may include fundraising deadlines). Application Process

- □ Apply Online
- □ Check the GO LIST & WAIT LIST
- □ Accept Your Spot Once your name appears on the GO LIST, start the registration process *The link will appear online.

Registration Process–DUE October 2nd at 4:00pm

- **STEP 1:** Turn in the **Liberty Notarized Waiver Form** and **RIM Notarized Consent Form** to the Spiritual Life Office at Liberty
- □ **STEP 2: Register Online** only AFTER you have turned in the Notarized Forms Accurate information is important –\$95 non-refundable deposit required to submit

VERY IMPORTANT: If you submit the registration and deposit but do NOT submit the Notarized forms by October 2nd at 4:00pm, you will lose your spot on the GO LIST and your \$95 deposit!

*WAIT LIST students do <u>not</u> register until a spot opens. RIM will offer it to you and you'll have 3 days to accept.

Immediately

- Apply for Passport/Verify/Renew If you have one, go ahead and upload it!
 If you need one, apply immediately
 Renew if it expires before 9/15/24 (RIM requires 6 months of validity beyond the trip)
- □ Verify Immunizations Make an appointment soon if additional shots are necessary

Real Impact Missions is a multi-denominational Christian organization that mobilizes individuals and groups for short-term missions. On the trip application, participants signed to verify they read and understood RIM's policies and values. You can find our Statement of Faith, values, leadership structure, safety measures, and FAQs at: **Realimpact.com/about-us**.

Team Structure

Teams consist of 25-35 students who minister together throughout the trip. Each team has male and female Team Leaders (TLs) as well as several Mission Advisors (MAs) who remain with them during the entire ministry schedule. Multiple teams may be deployed to each country. In addition, RIM Project Directors (PDs) provide spiritual and logistical oversight for the entire trip and rotate between the teams during outreach.

Discipline

Be advised that RIM and your group leaders have partnered to establish behavioral guidelines for the trip. These rules ensure the safety and well-being of each team member and help teams to maintain the highest degree of Christian integrity so that they can minister effectively in a cross-cultural setting. RIM and your group leaders may send any team member home that shows disregard for rules and regulations. <u>THE TEAM MEMBER'S FAMILY IS RESPONSIBLE FOR</u> <u>ANY COSTS INVOLVED IN SENDING THE TEAM MEMBER HOME.</u> This may include, but is not limited to, international airfare, hotel room and meals.

Rules

Breaking the following rules while on a RIM trip will result in a "Bon Voyage" or "BV" – Students who break these may or may not receive a warning, and then **they will be sent home**:

- No possession or use of illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco products
- No smoking, including e-cigarettes or vape
- No use of someone else's prescription drugs
- No fireworks, firearms or other weapons
- Never be outside of the lodging complex alone or without a leader in your group
- No romantic involvement of any kind during training or on the mission field (No new relationships with teammates, translators or people you meet in country, and any pre-existing relationships on the team must be placed on hold with no alone time or PDA.)
- No entrance into opposite gender living quarters
- No stealing
- No pornography

If a student breaks any other church/school rules or trip rules while on the mission, he or she may be subject to disciplinary action by RIM staff and/or the group leadership. Students must not be involved in any kind of behavior that jeopardizes the mission or is a negative witness for the team or their own personal relationship with God. They must participate and actively engage with others during both ministry and team times.

Dress Code

All church/school rules regarding dress apply during the trip. In addition:

- Shorts and tank tops may not be worn during ministry (for all participants)
- Close-toed shoes (and sometimes pants) are required for work projects
- **SWIMWEAR:** Girls must wear one-piece suits or have a dark-colored t-shirt over a twopiece. Guys must wear t-shirts to/from the pool/beach.
- **CHURCH CLOTHES:** Girls must have a knee length skirt or below, with a nice blouse or a long dress that is not sleeveless. Guys must have khaki or dress pants and a button down, collared shirt.



Important Information

Passports

If you already have one:

- □ Verify that the expiration date is at least 6 MONTHS after the trip (9/15/24)
- □ If it expires before 9/15/24, you will need to send it in to be renewed
 - Follow the same instructions for a new passport
 - You will need to mail your old passport in with your new application
- **Upload** a copy of your Passport at realimpact.com/liberty now or by December 8th

If you don't have a passport:

- □ Apply for your passport immediately!!
 - Get an official 2" x 2" Passport Photo taken (\$10 at Walgreens, CVS or UPS)
 - Visit http://travel.state.gov/content/passports/english/passports/apply.html
 - \circ $\;$ Fill out the online form and then print out a copy
 - Bring the form and picture to your county courthouse or your local post office
 - \circ You also need your birth certificate, social security number, parent(s) and \$135
 - Allow 6-8 weeks processing time
- Upload a copy of your Passport to RIM via the instructions in "Required Forms" as soon as you receive it

If you have a foreign passport:

- □ Make sure you have all needed travel documents to enter the country(s) of international travel and to return
 - Be aware many countries require a visa/additional documentation for entry (i.e. proof of vaccination, etc.)
- □ Have all travel documents to reenter the U.S. or your country

There are also **RUSH SERVICE AGENCIES** to get you your passport in a hurry. You can find these with a quick Google search, but they are expensive and add an additional fee (\$100+ above and beyond the cost of the passport). If you have questions, call RIM at 1.800.774.6746. We are here to help you!

International Insurance Instructions

Real Impact Missions requires all travelers to have full coverage for foreign travel that includes \$1,000,000 or more medical and emergency evacuation, repatriation of remains, accidental death and dismemberment, and a \$0 deductible. Most domestic health insurance you already have will not fully meet these requirements, so RIM is partnering with MissionSafe Insurance to provide you with sufficient coverage. Parents are responsible for any charges while oversees and will need to fill out a claim upon return to US.RIM leaders will have all of the insurance card information in country. If you would like a copy of the card, just call RIM and we will send it to you.

Immunizations

Based on the August 2023 Center for Disease Control recommendations for Dominican Republic **RIM requires:**

- Up-to-date childhood immunizations (required)*
- Up-to-date Tetanus (required, no exceptions)
- Hepatitis A (required)*
- Typhoid (strongly recommended)

All information is subject to change, so we do recommend that you contact the CDC, your local health department or travel clinic, or your physician closer to the trip.

*Do you usually submit a waiver to your school? We can help – please call RIM at 800-774-6746 before fundraising for your trip. Exemptions are not possible for Tetanus.

Mandatory Training Weekend

All students are **required** to attend a training weekend on February 17th & 18th, 2024 a few weeks before the trip. This training takes place at Liberty and is all day long for 2 days. All students must wear close-toed shoes. Meals are provided by Liberty during the weekend, and there is a separate fee for this, paid directly to Liberty.

During the weekend, students learn their part in the evangelistic drama presentation used throughout the trip. Every student has a role so it is mandatory they attend. In addition, we do team building and learn about evangelism strategies and sharing testimonies.

Parent Meeting & Drama Preview

On the final night of training, there is an important parent meeting with a Q&A session plus a chance to watch your student perform what they have learned. RIM will be present for any final paperwork, finances, questions, or issues. Meeting time is tentatively set at 6:00pm on Feb 18th.

Travel Days

Detailed instructions for Travel Days will be provided during the Parent Meeting (see above).

Special Dietary Needs or Restrictions

Real Impact Missions does not accommodate specialized dietary needs (whether medically necessary or personal preference). If a participant is vegan, vegetarian, gluten-free, lactose intolerant, has a food allergy, or has any other dietary need/restriction, that individual must pack all necessary supplemental food items for their trip in their luggage.

Financial Information

The fundraising goal of the March 8-15, 2024, Dominican Republic mission trip is \$3095.

Fundraising Deadlines

Funds can be added online at realimpact.com/Liberty:

- \$95 non-refundable deposit due 2 weeks after acceptance
- \$1000 more due November 8th / Total balance of \$1095 or more required
- \$1000 more due December 8th / Total balance of \$2095 or more required
- \$1000 more due February 8th / Total balance of \$3095 required (100%)

Students are encouraged to fundraise as much as possible and to begin the process early. If a fundraising deadline arrives and a student's account is short, they will be required to make up the difference by adding personal funds. If the same student later raises excess funds, no refunds are available per IRS regulations.

For WAIT LIST students (if applicable):

- The above payment deadlines apply to you as well
 - You have 3 DAYS to catch up on deadlines that have already passed
 - \circ $\;$ You may not fundraise through RIM until you are officially accepted
 - RIM will not secure airfare until payments have been received and processed

For Team Leaders (Faculty selected by Liberty):

- You must Register once you are asked to be a leader
- Your trip cost (if any) and your forms are 100% due on February 6th

Late Fees & Airline Surcharges

Missed deadlines can result in a \$35 late fee for each deadline. If you are concerned about a particular deadline, <u>call RIM before the deadline to request an extension</u>. In addition, an airline surcharge may be added to your trip cost if your ticket is purchased later than everyone else's airfare. This can occur if you joined the team late or failed to meet a fundraising deadline. Airfare costs (including taxes and government fees) often increase closer to the travel date.

Refund Policy

All donations received by Real Impact Missions go toward project expenses and are nonrefundable. To receive a tax deduction, donations cannot be designated to a specific individual. Each individual is a fundraiser for the RIM project and the funds raised go toward project costs and participation. Funds are non-transferable.

Trip Withdrawal

If an individual is unable to participate in the Real Impact experience, the funds he or she has raised, less deposit, incurred expenses and administrative fees, will remain credited to the project for one year. You can request to use those funds on a future trip that you sign up for within one year of your current trip. This includes future Liberty trips as well as RIM's summer trips open to individuals. 30 days before the trip, 100% of funds have been used toward project expenses and therefore cannot be credited toward future projects or trips.

Extra Funds

If you make a donation and/or raise funds in excess of the amount needed for this trip, RIM cannot return that money to you or to your donors. However, you can request to use that money on a future RIM/Liberty trip or standard RIM trip that you sign up for within one year of your current trip. (1 - 4 weeks long, see **realimpact.com** for outreach opportunities!)

Tax-Deductible Donations

Real Impact Missions (RIM) is a registered 501(c)3 organization and all donations to RIM are taxdeductible. All financial activity is filed annually on a Form 990 Corporate Federal Return. **Checks should be made payable to** *Real Impact Missions*. In order to receive proper tax credit, the **name of the RIM missionary may** <u>NOT</u> **appear anywhere on the check**. When sending in checks to RIM, please use the donation coupon (p. 24) or a note with the participant's full name and trip. RIM sends out donor receipts in January according to IRS requirements.

Receiving Donations & Adding Money to Your Account

Your donors may give towards your portion of the project using any of the following methods:

- Mail a check to Real Impact Missions, PO Box 1532, Gainesville, GA 30503
 *Include a card with the participant's name and trip, but do <u>NOT</u> write their name on the check itself
 *Make checks payable to Real Impact Missions
- **Give online at realimpact.com/donate/** Enter the participant's name and trip
- Click GREEN DONATE BUTTON on an individual's public profile link See page 23
- Visit realimpact.com/liberty and click "donate" near the bottom of the page

If you prefer to collect the checks yourself and then send them to RIM in a group:

- Mail the checks in at least once a month so donors don't wait long for them to deposit
- Include a RIM donation coupon (final page of your packet) or a note w/your name & trip
- Donations must arrive <u>before</u> fundraising deadlines to be counted toward that deadline

Processing Time

Below are the normal processing times for various types of donations. Near to a fundraising deadline or year-end giving, please allow additional time for donations to post to your account.

- **Checks** Mailing time + 2 business days
- Online Giving via realimpact.com 2 business days
- Online Giving via Public Profile Added immediately in real time, no processing needed

Note: Business days for Real Impact Missions are Monday to Thursday, 9am-5pm EST

Required Forms

In an effort to keep things as simple and easy as possible, most of the required paperwork and donations for your mission trip can be submitted online. PRE-TRIP PREPARATION

The following is a list of things you can do to better prepare you for your mission trip:

- **Pray** This is by far the most important part. Begin to pray for the country, the people, for divine appointments, for your team, and for the finances to come in for your trip.
- **Research** Research your country as much as possible; the people, history, major religion(s), culture. Travel books and the internet can give you a good feel for the country.
- **Read Your Bible** Especially read books like Romans and John, that can help you while witnessing. Memorize relevant scriptures that you can use in personal evangelism.
- **Read** Read Christian books that encourage you in your walk with God.
- **Prepare Your Testimony** Practice sharing your testimony, approximately 1 to 2 minutes long. It can either be about your salvation experience, a miracle God has done in your life, a healing, or God's provision that you've experienced. Make sure it's personal. Your Project Directors and Team Leaders will continue to help and coach you.
- Learn the Four Spiritual Laws The following principles are a great tool as you share the gospel message:
 - 1. God loves you and created you to have a personal relationship with Him. *John 3:16, John 17:3*
 - 2. Man is sinful and guilty before God, who is perfect and just. Sin has separated man from God and the relationship between them is broken. We must repent. *Romans 3:23, 2 Thess. 1:8-9*
 - 3. Jesus Christ is God's solution for man's sin. Through Him alone you can have a personal relationship (He died in our place, rose from the dead and is the only way to God). *I Peter 3:18, Romans 5:8, John 14:6*
 - 4. We must each respond and ask Jesus Christ into our lives as Savior and Lord. John 1:12, Romans 12



Things to Bring

Each participant may bring (1) CHECKED BAG and (1) CARRY-ON BAG. You may be asked to pack up to 5lbs of team supplies in your checked bag so leave space. Do NOT bring valuables you would be upset to lose, like cell phones, tablets, expensive jewelry, etc. If your team is doing the drama, you will wear your drama costume for 3 days, so you do not need a lot of regular clothes.

Carry-On Bag (Small backpack or day pack)

- Passport/travel documents
- □ Spending money for snacks/souvenirs
- □ Bible, devotional book, pens
- Drama costume and props (except power sticks and ribbons, which must be checked)
- **D** Prescription or personal medication

Checked Bag (45lbs or less, rolling suitcase/hiking backpack, no hard shell cases)

- (1) Church outfit Girls: Knee length dress or skirt and blouse (not sleeveless, tight-fitting or low cut); Guys: khaki or dress pants and a collared shirt
- (1) Adventure day outfit Long shorts, t-shirt, swimsuit, and beach towel (just in case)
 *Girls swimsuits must be one-piece or have a dark-colored t-shirt over two-piece
 **Guys must wear a t-shirt to/from pool or beach
- □ (7) Sets of undergarments and socks
- □ (1) Pair of pajamas/conservative sleepwear
- **(**2) Sets of work clothes (long pants and t-shirts that might get ruined/stained)
- □ (1) Pair of work gloves
- **1** (2) Pairs of tennis/athletic shoes, comfy for walking, sturdy enough for work projects
- □ (1) Pair of flip-flops and/or shower shoes
- □ (3-4) Sets of clothes to wear around lodging complex (shorts, t-shirts, jeans)
- □ (1) Sweatshirt/jacket
- □ (1) Plastic bottle of either peanut butter or jelly (grape/strawberry)-More info at parent meeting
- **D** Twin-sized sheets, light blanket, small travel pillow, washcloth, and a towel
- **D** Toiletries (shampoo, soap, deodorant, toothpaste, toothbrush, contact solution, etc.)
- **C** Contacts or glasses (if you wear them)
- **3**2oz Water Bottle (Nalgene or similar brand, must be re-useable and shatterproof)
- **Outdoor supplies (sunscreen, insect repellant, sunglasses/hat, rain poncho)**
- **D** Tools (more info at parent meeting)
- □ Miscellaneous extras (alarm clock, flashlight, healthy snacks) OPTIONAL!!

Essential Dominican Republic Info

The Location

The beautiful paradise known as the Dominican Republic and famous for its beaches and resorts takes up the eastern two-thirds of the island of Hispaniola (shared with Haiti). It is home to 10.2 million people, and more than 70% of them live in big cities. Our team will serve primarily in the capital city, Santo Domingo, and nearby villages.

The Condition

Dominicans belong to at least 18 distinct people groups and have a strong cultural value for religion. They all speak Spanish, though some may speak English or a Haitian dialect. There are also several tribal languages spoken in rural areas. Unfortunately, while 94% of Dominicans consider themselves Christians, only about 9% are evangelicals who personally know Jesus. Another 11% have still not even heard the Gospel! The big need is to demonstrate what it looks like to have a personal relationship with God. Though they're very devout and religious, most Dominicans don't know Him!

The Strategy

Friendly by nature, it's easy to meet people and initiate conversations in the Dominican. When sharing your faith, make sure to explain personal relationship with Jesus, not religion. Recognize that Christianity (and/or Catholicism) is more of a culture than a faith. Don't ask if people are Christians. Skip that question and instead ask if they know Jesus personally. If you've performed the drama, ask what parts of the presentation relate to their life or the lives of people they know. Poverty and alcohol are big issues down there, as are depression and a longing for something more. As you talk, ask questions about their lives and answer questions about your own. Strategically use your personal testimony to show them what a personal relationship with Jesus looks like. Briefly and honestly share your struggles (but don't glorify them), and then focus on how Jesus saved you, changed you, healed you or gave you hope!

Also, **practice your Spanish**! A strong and immediate bridge can be built with your new Dominican friends if you know just a few phrases in their language. The fact that you made an attempt will mean a lot. You'll develop a close rapport almost immediately!

Cultural Tips

Baseball and basketball are popular and great conversation starters! (Soccer, however, is reserved for high society people in the DR, very different than it is in Central America.) Note that personal space in the Dominican is smaller than it is in America. If a Dominican is standing uncomfortably close to you, don't back away. You'll insult them without knowing it! Also, make sure to maintain eye contact while talking, but don't stare. In addition, recognize that saving face is important so never criticize someone in front of others. Always use proper titles when addressing people – Senor, Senora or Senorita, followed by their last name unless they invite you to use first names. These tips will create lasting relationships and Kingdom opportunities!

Challenges for Prayer

Begin to pray daily for the Dominican. Specifically pray for retention of converts and the follow up work our ministry partners will be doing. People are often very willing to accept Jesus, but religion is more of a cultural ideal than a personal lifestyle in the Dominican. Many who convert never connect with a local church, grow and serve there. Pray that God would orchestrate ways for new believers to connect to the Christian community after you go home.

Also, pray for religious liberty and biblical ethics. The Dominican experiences much government corruption, violent crime and promiscuous relationships. Ask the Lord to raise up leaders who will stand up for biblical principles as they make and enforce laws. In addition, pray against the bureaucratic antipathy and low-level hostility toward Christians who enter the political arena.

Finally, pray for churches in the Dominican to cultivate a missional vision. In just the last decade, Dominican Christians have started sending their own missionaries to other countries to share the Gospel and their desire for missions is on fire. Pray for this to grow and increase as more and more Dominican missionaries are called, trained and deployed to the nations!

Our Ministry Schedule

As we worship and serve together, our team will bring light into the spiritual darkness and help the truth of the Gospel shine brighter than ever!! The week will include:

- 1.5 days of community development projects
- 3 days of Gospel presentations in schools
- Church services, home visits, feedings or sports ministry (baseball/basketball)

Spanish Basic Sayings

These are SO IMPORTANT... Even just being able to speak a few words in Spanish will help you build relationships and open doors for the Gospel. If you've never formally studied Spanish, try practicing these basic sayings before your trip. You can also look online for Spanish resources, tutorials and even live people who will practice with you!

- Buenos dias Good morning / Good day / Hello
- Buenas tardes Good afternoon
- Buenas noches Good night
- Gracias Thank you
- *De nada* You're welcome
- *Mucho gusto –* Pleased to meet you
- Igualmente or Igual Same to you (ex. as the response to "pleased to meet you")
- Con permiso Excuse me
- Salud To your health / Cheers!
- Hola Hello
- Adios Goodbye
- Donde esta el bano? Where is the bathroom?
- Donde esta el estacion de autobus? Where's the bus station?
- Como se Ilama? / Como te Ilamas? What's your name? (se for adults, te for teens/kids)
- Que hora es? What time is it?
- Lo siento l'm sorry
- Jesus te ama Jesus loves you
- Dios te bendiga God bless you
- Cuanto cuesta esto? How much is this?
- **Cuanto mas tiempo?** How much longer? (Alternately, *Cuanto falta?* How much is left?)
- **Por favor repitalo mas despacio** Please repeat that more slowly
- No hablo espanol I don't speak Spanish
- Esta limpia esta agua? Is the water filtered?
- *Si* Yes
- *No* No

Spanish Plan of Salvation

Read this dialogue aloud several times before your trip... It'll build your confidence to share!

Hi, my name is... *Hola, me llamo...* Did you understand the drama? ¿Entendiste la obra de teatro?

God wants you to know Him personally, but our sins separate us from God. *Dios quiere que le conozcas personalmente, pero nuestros pecados nos separan de Dios.*

God sent His Son Jesus to die on the cross so we could once again have a way to God. Dios envoi a su hijo Jesuscristo a morir en la cruz para que tuvieramos un camino hacia Dios.

God then raised Him from the dead to give us eternal life through Jesus. *Dios entonces resucitó a su hijo de la muerte para darnos vida eterna.*

God wants you to: *Dios quiere que tu:*

- 1) **Turn away from your sin.** *Te arrepientas de tus pecados.*
- 2) Receive His forgiveness and eternal life through Jesus. Recibas su perdon y vida eterna por medio de su hijo Jesus.

The Bible says that if you believe God raised Jesus from the dead and confess Him as your Lord, you will be saved. La biblia dice que si tu crees que Dios resucitó a Jesus de la muerte y confiesas con tu boca que Jesus es Senor serás salvo.

When you confess this, you are made a new person through Jesus Christ. His Spirit gives you eternal life and victory over sin, sickness and death. *Cuando tu confiesas esto, eres una nueva criatura en Jesucristo. Tu espiritu le da vida eterna y victoria sobre tus pecados, enfermedades y la muerte.*

Do you want to receive Christ as your personal Savior? ¿Quieres recibir a Cristo como tu Salvador personal?

We can pray for you right now to receive Jesus. Podemos orar ahora para recibir a Jesus.





How to Create a RIM Funding Page (Public Profile)



It's called SOCIAL GIVING... Real Impact Mission's public profiles are one of the most effective tools we provide to help you raise money for your trip, and you receive **100% of the funds donated through this page** (unlike other

fundraising sites that charge a fee). The power of peer-to-peer fundraising when combined with modern technology is incredible! For example, we saw one student raise \$1,314 in 9 days and another raise \$2,400 in two weeks!

How to Create a Public Profile

- Login to http://realimpact.managedmissions.com
- Click Liberty Dominican Republic 24
- Click Edit my public profile (top right)
- Write a note to supporters
- Add a picture (clear, just you, not goofy)
- Click Submit for Approval
- Notice your personal **Public Profile URL** link
- Run several campaigns (ex. once a month)



How to Run a Campaign

- Choose a specific financial goal (ex. \$630, your first fundraising deadline)
- Choose a specific set of dates (ex. 3 days the weekend after you're accepted)
- Post updates several times a day each day about your trip that includes your link
- The first few updates should tell people that you're going on a trip and need their help
- Subsequent posts should give updates about how much \$ is raised between posts
- At the end of the time, post thank you messages and final results
- Encourage your close friends and family to SHARE your posts throughout the days
- Repeat this once a month between now and your trip
- Consider using Facebook, TikTok, Instagram, etc.

*Note: It's important to post multiple times per day because of social media algorithms.

FUNDRAISING GUIDE

Getting the Funds...

Often, this feels like the biggest obstacle to people as they prepare for their mission trip, but it is also the greatest opportunity to experience God's provision and miraculous intervention! Here are some practical tools and biblical encouragement as you work to raise your funds:

- **God will supply** <u>all</u> **of your needs.** Read Philippians 4:19. It's a promise! Cling to this... If God has truly called you to go on this trip, He will provide all of your needs.
- **Missions is God's heart.** He is the One who told us to "Go into all the world." God would not instruct us to do this if He didn't intend to help us complete the task.
- **Pray.** At RIM, prayer is the foundation that we build our mission experiences on. Pray for God to multiply your efforts, increase your finances and bring you prayer partners.
- Make a list of prospective partners. Fundraising is less about money and more about relationships. God has given us relationships for a variety of purposes. He uses relationships to reach the world! Good stewardship of your relationships means including people in what you are doing overseas. Think of all the people you know that can join with your trip either financially or in prayer. Write down names of friends, relatives, church members, local businesses, business owners, etc. that you can send a support letter to. In addition, begin to think of ways to use social media to tell even more people.
- **Prayer Partners.** Choose 5 people and ask them to commit to pray for your trip. Provide them with the schedule, country information, your personal needs (like finances) and have them pray especially for ministry effectiveness.
- Write a letter for support. This is a great way to let people know what you are doing and what God is doing in your life. Send letters to at least 30 people.
- Follow your letter with a phone call. We know this sounds scary, but it is actually really fun! 2 weeks after you send your letters, make a personal phone call to each person. Ask if they received this letter. Take this opportunity to explain more about your desire to go. Ask them for prayer/financial commitment.
- **Create a Public Profile and plan social media campaigns.** See page 19. These days, social media allows us to connect with hundreds and thousands of people who want to be a part of what God is doing around the world!!
- Be creative. Try some unexpected ways to raise funds... Check out the next page for ideas!
- **Trust God.** Once you have done <u>all</u> that you know to do, look to God to do the rest. He'll do "exceedingly, abundantly above all that we can ask or imagine." (Ephesians 3:20)

Creative Fundraising Ideas

If you find yourself at a loss for ideas, try these:

- Sponsor a Day Divide your trip cost by the number of days you'll be gone. (ex. \$2,095 trip divided by 15 days = \$140 per day) Ask people to choose a date (ex. August 2nd) and sponsor the entire day. Keep track of who sponsors which day. After the trip, show them your pictures and journal entries of what happened that day.
- **Per Mile Traveled** Have people pledge to sponsor you for a certain number of miles (that you will travel from your home city to your ministry). Example, if your trip is \$2,095 and your journey is 4802 miles, people can sponsor you for \$0.44/mile.
- Youth Sunday/Special Offering Ask your pastor if your team can share during one of the services and then take up a special missions offering.
- Sell Stuff Bake sale, garage sale, jewelry sale, t-shirt sale, candy sale, flower sale...
- Serve People Car wash, babysit, yardwork, walking pets, cleaning houses, painting...
- _____-a-thon Host a walk-a-thon, dance-a-thon, rock-a-thon. Get sponsors for a 5K, etc.
- Media Fast/Sugar Fast/Caffeine Fast Choose one of these to give up between now and your next deadline. Have people sponsor the number of days you go without TV or chocolate or soda or coffee. Show them you are committed to this trip!
- Local TV/Radio/Newspaper See if they will support you, interview you or write an article about what you are doing and how others can get involved.
- **Tournament** Host a golf tournament and invite local businessmen to participate for a \$100 donation as their entrance fee. Consider other spots and hosting a 5K as well!
- **Concessions** Sell candy and soda pop at special events.
- **Stadiums & Theme Parks** Find out about opportunities for your whole group to clean up after a game and/or run a concession stand for a whole day in exchange for a donation.
- **Design** Create custom hats, t-shirts or wrist bands and sell them.
- **Sponsors** Ask a local business to match other donations you receive dollar-for-dollar.
- Auction Live or silent. This could be a good one to do as a group!
- **Music** Ask a local band or drama team to do a benefit performance.
- Coffee Host a coffeehouse or sell lattes after church. Why not dessert too?
- **Collect Change** Label mason jars for your trip and have people collect spare change.
- **Recycle** If you live in a state that encourages it, there may be money to earn from this.
- Arts & Crafts Have people donate handmade items and sell the donated items.
- Get a Job!

The opportunities are endless... Be creative. You can do this! Trust God and work hard!!

How to Write a Support Letter

The most important thing to remember in writing your support letter is that you are not just asking a bunch of people for money. Rather, you are giving people an opportunity to go on your trip with you... to share in the experience of proclaiming God's love to people who may never have heard the Gospel before. You are giving people who can't go on a mission trip themselves a chance to be an active participant in the Great Commission!

Basic guidelines for writing your letter:

- Share your heart. Explain what God has done in your life to bring you to the point of going on a mission trip. In a few sentences, describe why you picked this specific trip.
- **Tell about the place.** Write several facts about the country you will serve, the ministry you will do, and how long you will be gone.
- **Relate the need.** Explain the cost of the trip and your financial need. Communicate what you will be doing on your own to help with the cost (odd jobs, babysitting, carwash, etc.).
- Invite people to participate. Ask potential supporters to join your team by giving or praying or both. Be sure to let them know that <u>all donations should be made out to Real</u> <u>Impact Missions and are tax deductible, and they should not put your name on the check</u>.
- **Explain how to give funds.** Provide them with details about giving online through your personal profile or the realimpact.com/donate website or by sending a check to RIM.
- **Close with thanks.** Let them know how much you appreciate them and thank them for their involvement. Encourage them to pray about how God would have them give.
- Include a self-addressed envelope (stamped if possible) and a commitment card for your supporters to send back. Make it easy for people. Do most of the work for them!

VERY IMPORTANT:

Be sure to tell your supporters that your name cannot appear anywhere on the check they send or else their gift will not be tax-deductible. They should fill out the commitment card you provide or just put a note with their check explaining who it's for and what trip.

Sample Support Letter

Dear Uncle Bob & Aunt Janet,

In the past few weeks, our school has been studying missions, and God has showed me His heart to reach the lost. My youth group is going on a mission trip to Panama (your country) with Real Impact Missions (RIM) this summer, and I have decided to join the team.

Because of the US legacy in Panama, citizens who live in big cities or near the Canal have access to many things that Americans have...safe running water, cars, TVs and good jobs. Many of them also speak English, even though the official language is Spanish. But at the same time, Panama is also home to several tribes of Amerindians who live in abject poverty and don't have access to adequate educational opportunities. The distance between these two groups is mere miles. They're next-door neighbors.

The one thing they have in common is their need for Jesus. Throughout Panama, most people are religious and place cultural importance on rituals and traditions, but very few know a personal God who wants to have an intimate relationship with them as Savior and Lord. My team and I will be learning an evangelistic drama that opens doors for us to perform in public schools. Following our presentation, we will use oneon-one conversations with students to share our faith. A recent team saw 1100 students give their lives to Jesus in just 3 days! RIM's main ministry partner in Panama has asked for more teams to come immediately.

My youth group will be responding to this need. Our trip is August 1-15, 2024 and costs \$2,995. I am babysitting and doing odd jobs to earn part of this money, but I need help reaching my goal. Please consider sponsoring me with your tax-deductible financial gift and, most importantly, prayer. The deadline for my initial deadline is November 8th; so, if you can help me, please consider dropping a check in the mail today or giving online at {insert personal profile URL here or realimpact.com/donate/}. Your gift would be an investment into someone's eternal life. Please pray and do whatever God leads you to do. To receive a tax deduction, it is very important that you **do not put my name on the check**. Make your check payable to Real Impact Missions and mail it to: {insert your address or RIM's address}.
